	<p>law, and more all have a place in PsySciSo.</p> <p>Psychedelics are being researched as therapeutics for a diverse and expanding group of conditions including, but not limited to, depression, anxiety, OCD, PTSD, cluster headaches, substance use disorders, and anorexia nervosa. Additionally, psychedelics are being explored as treatment for comorbidities such as depression associated with cancer or Alzheimer’s Disease. As psychedelics enter the clinical sphere, there has also been an increase in research on the mechanisms responsible for the effects of psychedelics on the mind. From animal models to human studies, this basic work is furthering our understanding of these compounds and the potential benefits and risks of their usage. With a very recent resurgence in funding for psychedelic research, and with institutions of higher education such as UC Berkeley, Stanford, Yale, Johns Hopkins reopening (or opening) their psychedelic science research initiatives for the first time since their ban in the mid 1960s, we find ourselves in the midst of a psychedelic renaissance, where there is massive potential and opportunity to connect an array of students under the domain of psychedelic-academic discourse.</p>
