NAME OF CLUB	DESCRIPTION & DETAILS
Computer Science Club	The Computer Science Club is a place for students interested in STEM! We will be working on large-scale projects, hosting workshops for real-world use of computer science, and meeting regularly to update everybody about upcoming activities. Poetry Club	The Poetry Club is an opportunity for students who love to read and/or write poetry to share their passion in a supportive environment. Respiratory Care Club	To function as a fundraising and supportive organization; respiratory therapy students encouraging each other, participating in community and campus events to bring awareness to the profession and lung health and focusing efforts on raising funds to alleviate the cost of required credentialing examinations not covered by the program, grants, scholarships, or other forms of financial aid.
Sikh Student Association	The Sikh Student Association or SSA is an organization supported through United Sikh Movement(USM). USM offers SSAs a four pillar structure that helps to combine all forms of Sikhi and school into the organizations which are Simran(meditation) seva (selfless service), Sangat (company/fellowship) & Academics. Within this structure, SSAs host activities that help students develop Sikh oriented habits that include the three principles of sikhi Naam japo (recite its name), Kirat Karo (Earn honest living) and Vand Chako (share with the needs). Its purpose is to promote awareness and understanding of Sikh culture, traditions, and values among students. The club often organizes events, discussions, and cultural activities to foster a sense of community and educate others about Sikhism.
Young Americans for Liberty	Focuses on promoting values such as individual liberty, free markets, limited government, and personal responsibility. Engaging in political activism, education, and advocacy efforts. The club often hosts events and speakers to raise awareness about constitutional principles
